

An office in the basement seldom offers the positive energy needed to inspire the work that has to get done. In today's market, a stylish home office is a real estate "hot button" that's high on a homebuyer's wish list.

An octagon-shaped business space was designed with large picturesque windows overlooking the conservation area. It only made sense to echo the natural elements through the use of bird's-eye maple on the walls and ceiling, and staining the white-oak floors to match.
